### The Project

Participatory budgeting (PB) is the participation of non-elected citizens to the allocation of public funds. This means that citizens, usually in a municipality setting, can **propose projects and take a vote**.

Computer Science has formal ideas about fairness in this process and in the methods used to determine the election outcome (voting rules). The purpose of CitizenPB is to **determine what ideas of fairness citizens care about** with regards to the PB process and PB voting rules.
